<u>Materials</u>

You must bring a pencil, paper, and a book to read *every day*. Paper and pencils will *not* be provided by Mr. Petersen.

<u>Grade Breakdown</u>

Attendance-	40%
Journals-	20%
Discussion Participation-	20%
Working/Reading-	20%

Attendance - 20 points each day

- It is extremely important to attend Advisory *every day*
- Each day is worth 20 points
- You will lose 10 points for an unexcused tardy
- Absences will be given no points

<u>**Journals**</u>- Out of 10 points

- Students are expected to keep a journal in their binder
- Mr. Petersen will check these every Monday and give students prompts to write on
- Missed journals can be made up any time that week if the student was absent

Discussion Participation - Out of 10 points

- Every Wednesday, we will hold a class discussion on the news or on school issues
- Participation is required if a student is asked (at random) to participate

Work Days- Out of 10 points

- Students are expected to work on homework during work days
- If students do not have any homework, they are expected to have a book to read

Office Business-10 points each

- Sometimes, the office hands down important business during advisory
- When this happens, it takes priority over whatever we usually do on that day
- Unless this occurs, our schedule is as follows:

<u>Citizenship</u>

- All students start out with a 3 and work towards one of the following:
 - 4- No tardies or sluffs, always on-task and prepared, is helpful towards other students and the teacher, and is never disruptive
 - 3- No more than 1 tardy, on-task, will do as the teacher asks after being told once
 - $\circ~$ 2- No more than 3 tardies, usually on-task and prepared, sometimes disruptive
 - 1- No more than 4 tardies, frequently unprepared and off task, disruptive, and disrespectful
 - 0-5 or more tardies, 1 sluff, almost never prepared or on-task, constantly disruptive or defiant towards the teacher

<u>Rules</u>

Class rules based on the Jefferson vision of *CAR* – Citizenship, Academics, and Real-Life Skills

Citizenship

- Treat all people in the classroom with respect
- There is no eating in this class
 - Any food or gum seen by the teacher will be thrown away without warning
- The teacher dismisses the class, not the bell

Academics

- Come to class prepared every day
- Participate in class activities
- Be in your seat and ready for the day when the bell rings

Real – Life Skills

- Keep your area clean
- Language must be classroom appropriate (No swearing, put-downs, goofing off, etc.)
- Listen to and follow teacher directions at all times

Discipline Plan-What if you don't?

- Single incidents will result in a warning
- Repeated incidents will result in time after school to talk with Mr. Petersen
- Serious incidents (such as defiance, constant disruption, never turning work in) will have to be worked out on a case-by-case basis by Mr. Petersen
